## **MINOR in INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS for Business Majors**



Students who are pursuing a four-year degree in business may add a Minor in International Business as they pursue a major in one of the functional areas. Students who elect this program must notify their advisor before the end of their junior year.

Although not a formal prerequisite, BUS-D300 International Business Administration (which is a required course for all business students) is the foundation course for the study of International Business and should be taken before BUS-F494 and BUS-M401.

Students must attain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 (C) in all four of the courses taken for the minor and not less than a C grade in each course. Please note that these courses may not be taken by correspondence study or independent study; they also may not be studied through an internship.
