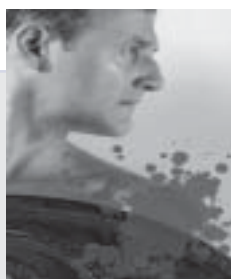

## Trip Information

The tour departs from the IU South Bend campus promptly at 6:30 a.m., Friday, Sept. 1. Our return is scheduled for approximately 11:30 p.m., Sunday, Sept. 3.

### Basic Tour Costs

Basic tour fee of \$679 includes motor coach transportation to and from Stratford, three plays of your choice, double-occupancy hotel accommodations, two breakfasts, limited in-town transportation, the services of an experienced tour staff and an expert faculty resource, choice of backstage, costume warehouse, or garden tour, refreshments along the way, a box supper on the bus Sunday evening, and travel gratuities.
