1. Application fee: A non-refundable application fee of U.S. \$55.00 is required of every applicant. A U.S. check or money order should be enclosed when returning the application form. (We cannot accept checks/banks drafts drawn from foreign banks.)
2. Original academic records and their English translation (if applicable).
3. English Report (TOEFL preferred).
4. Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) (If you completed secondary school more than one year ago, the SAT requirement is waived.)
5. GMAT for applicants to the MBA, Masters in Accounting, or Masters in Information Technology programs.
6. GRE for applicants to the Masters in Applied Math/Computer Science, Education, English, Liberal Studies or Public Affairs programs.
7. Three Letters of recommendation: For graduate student applicants only.
8. Statement of purpose (300 – 500 word writing sample).
9. Evidence of financial support: Submit an original bank statement and sponsor letter (if applicable).
10. Copy of passport identification page(s).

EVIDENCE OF FINANCIAL SUPPORT

U.S. immigration regulations require nonimmigrant international students to present proof of financial support for the time they are studying in the United States. Privately sponsored students must submit a letter from the sponsor stating the amount that will be provided as well as confirmation from the sponsor's bank that sufficient funds are available to cover all study and living expenses for the first year of study. Government sponsored students must submit an official letter from the government specifying the terms of the scholarship. **We cannot issue a formal letter of admission or a visa certificate until we receive this documentation.**
