- You must maintain a 2.0 or higher cumulative grade point average (CGPA), otherwise, you will be put on academic probation. Your CGPA is _____. You must also maintain a 2.0 GPA in courses taken after admission to General Studies.
- You must successfully complete a minimum of 30 credits in upper (300-400) level courses. You have a total of _____ credits earned; you still need _____ credits.
- You are allowed a total of 30 credits in any one Professional School that are only counted as general elective credits, not as requirement credits in area A, B, or C.
- You are allowed a total of 21 credits in any one department in area A, B, or C.
- You must successfully complete at least 30 of the 120 required credit hours at IU South Bend.
- A maximum of 90 transfer credits may be applied toward the BGS, with no more than 64 credits from community and/or junior colleges.
